### Special Session:

#### AP Resources and Administration for AP Coordinators, Middle and High School Counselors and Administrators:

This workshop provides an in-depth survey of ways to start and support an AP program. Day one is geared toward administrators, exploring ways to provide support for their AP teachers and students in helping them learn how to use data to promote equitable growth. It will also provide tools for assessing existing AP programs, and cover specific administrative topics, such as models for obtaining financial support, school policies, and use of block schedules. The remainder of the week is designed to assist counselors and school administrators in increasing student preparation for and achievement in AP courses and in directing academic and counseling programs in both middle school and high school. This session will also provide training for new and experienced AP Coordinators. A special one-day rate is available for administrators who wish to attend the first day only.
