Instructions

Section I of this exam contains 115 multiple-choice questions. Fill in only the ovals for numbers 1 through 115 on your answer sheet. Because this section offers only four answer options for each question, do not mark the (E) answer oval for any question.

Indicate all of your answers to the multiple-choice questions on the answer sheet. No credit will be given for anything written in this exam booklet, but you may use the booklet for notes or scratch work. After you have decided which of the suggested answers is best, completely fill in the corresponding oval on the answer sheet. Give only one answer to each question. If you change an answer, be sure that the previous mark is erased completely. Here is a sample question and answer.

Section I, Part A, is divided into four sets of questions based on color images printed in the Section I blue insert. Each set is based on one or two color images. You will have sixteen minutes to answer the questions in Part A, and you are advised to spend four minutes on each set of questions. The proctor will announce when each four-minute interval has elapsed, but you may proceed freely from one set to the next. After the proctor has announced the end of Section I, Part A, the blue insert will be collected.

Use your time effectively, working as quickly as you can without losing accuracy. Do not spend too much time on any one question. Go on to other questions and come back to the ones you have not answered if you have time. It is not expected that everyone will know the answers to all of the multiple-choice questions.

About Guessing

Many students wonder whether or not to guess the answers to questions about which they are not certain. In this section of the exam, as a correction for random guessing, one-third of the number of questions you answer incorrectly will be subtracted from the number of questions you answer correctly. If you are not sure of the best answer but have some knowledge of the question and are able to eliminate one or more of the answer choices, your chance of answering correctly is improved, and it may be to your advantage to answer such a question.

The questions for Section II are printed in this pink Section II booklet. The color images for Section II, Part B, are printed in the green insert. You may use the insert and/or any blank space above the questions to organize your thoughts or for scratch work, but you must write your answers on the lined pages in this pink booklet.

Write clearly and legibly. Do not skip lines. Cross out any errors you make; crossed-out work will not be scored.

Manage your time carefully. The proctor will announce the time for each part and question. You will have one hour to answer Questions 1 and 2 in Part A, and you are advised to spend 30 minutes on each question. The proctor will announce when each 30-minute interval has elapsed, but you may proceed freely from Question 1 to Question 2. You may review your responses in Part A if you finish before the end of Part A is announced, but you may NOT go on to Part B or open the Part B insert until you are told to do so.

You will then have one hour to answer Questions 3 through 9 in Part B. Each question is five or ten minutes, as indicated in the text of the question. The proctor will announce when the time for each question has elapsed, but you may proceed freely from one question to the next. You may review your responses if you finish before the end of the exam is announced.

These inserts include the color images that students will reference to answer the questions in these parts.

SECTION I: Multiple-Choice Questions

- ! **Do not begin the exam instructions below until you have completed the appropriate**
- **General Instructions for your group.**

Make sure you begin the exam at the designated time. When you have completed the General Instructions, say:

It is Wednesday afternoon, May 12, and you will be taking the AP Art History Exam. In a moment, you will open the packet that contains your exam materials. By opening this packet, you agree to all of the AP Program's policies and procedures outlined in the 2009-10 *Bulletin for AP Students and Parents*. You may now open your exam packet and take out the Section I booklet and sealed blue insert, but do not open the booklet or insert or the shrinkwrapped Section II materials. Put the white seals aside. Take the blue insert and, in the upper right-hand corner of the cover, print your name, your teacher's name, and your school's name. . . .

Put the blue insert aside for a moment. . . .

Read the statements on the front cover of Section I and look up when you have finished. . . .

Now sign your name, write today's date, and print your full legal name where indicated. Are there any questions? . . .

Answer any questions. Then say:

Now turn to the back cover and read it completely. Look up when you have finished. . . .

Are there any questions? . . .

Answer any questions. Then say:

Section I is the multiple-choice portion of the exam. You may never discuss the multiple-choice questions at any time in any form with anyone, including your teacher and other students. If you disclose these questions through any means, your AP Exam score will be canceled. Are there any questions? . . .

Answer any questions. Then say:

You must complete the answer sheet using a No. 2 pencil only. Mark all of your responses on your answer sheet, one response per question. Completely fill in the ovals. There are more answer ovals on the answer sheet than there are questions, so you will have unused ovals when you reach the end. Your answer sheet will be scored by machine; any stray marks or smudges could be read as answers. If you need to erase, do so carefully and completely. No credit will be given for anything written in the exam booklet or the blue insert. Scratch paper is not allowed, but you may use the margins or any blank space in the exam booklet or the blue insert for scratch work.

Section I has two parts. Part A, Questions 1 through 32, is based on color images in the blue insert. You have a total of 16 minutes to answer the four sets of questions in Part A, and you are advised to spend 4 minutes on each set. I will announce when each 4-minute interval has passed, but you may proceed freely from one set of questions to the next. Do not go on to Part B until I tell you to do so. Are there any questions? . . .

Answer all questions regarding procedure. Then say:

Now open your Section I booklet and read the directions for Part A. Look up when you have finished. . . .

When all students are ready, say:

Now open your blue insert to page 4 and begin with the first set of questions.

As you collect the blue inserts, check that each student has written his or her name on the front cover. When all Section I blue inserts have been collected and accounted for, say:

We're ready to start Part B. You have 44 minutes for this part. Open your booklet to page 8 and begin.



Note Start Time here _____. Note Stop Time here _____. You and your proctors should make sure students are marking their answers in pencil on their answer sheets, and that they are not looking at their shrinkwrapped Section II materials. After 44 minutes, say:

Stop working. Close your exam booklet and put your answer sheet on your desk, face up. I will now collect your answer sheet.

After you have collected an answer sheet from each student, say:

Take your seals and press one on each area of your exam booklet marked "PLACE SEAL HERE." Fold them over the open edges and press them to the back cover. When you have finished, place the booklet on your desk with the cover face up. I will now collect your Section I booklet.

As you collect the sealed Section I booklets, check that each student has signed the front cover. There is a 10-minute break between Sections I and II. When all Section I materials have been collected and accounted for and you are ready for the break, say:

Please listen carefully to these instructions before we take a break. Everything you placed under your chair at the beginning of the exam must remain there. You are not allowed to consult teachers, other students, or textbooks about the exam materials during the break. You may not make phone calls, send text messages, check e-mail, access a computer, calculator, cell phone, PDA, MP3 player, e-mail/messaging device, or any other electronic or communication device. Remember, you are not allowed to discuss the multiple-choice section of this exam with anyone at any time. Failure to adhere to any of these rules could result in cancellation of your score. Please leave your shrinkwrapped Section II package on top of your desk during the break. You may get up, talk, go to the restroom, or get a drink. Are there any questions? . . .

SECTION II: Free-Response Questions

After the break, say:

May I have everyone's attention? Place your Student Pack on your desk. . . .

You may now open the shrinkwrapped Section II package but do not open the shrinkwrapped green insert. Put the green insert aside. . . .

Read the bulleted statements on the front cover of the pink booklet. Look up when you have finished. . . .

Now place an AP number label on the shaded box. If you don't place an AP number label on this box, it may be impossible to identify your booklet, which could delay or jeopardize your AP score. If you don't have any AP number labels, write your AP number in the box. Look up when you have finished. . . .

Read the last statement. . . .

Using a pen with black or dark blue ink, print the first, middle, and last initials of your legal name in the boxes and print today's date where indicated. This constitutes your signature and your agreement to the conditions stated on the front cover. . . .

Turn to the back cover and read Item 1 under "Important Identification Information." Print your identification information in the boxes. Note that you must print the first two letters of your last name and the first letter of your first name. Look up when you have finished. . . .

In Item 2, print your date of birth in the boxes. . . .

Read Item 3 and copy the school code you printed on the front of your Student Pack into the boxes. . . .

Read Item 4. . . .

Are there any questions? . . .

Answer all questions regarding procedure. Then say:

I need to collect the Student Pack from anyone who will be taking another AP Exam. If you are taking another AP Exam, put your Student Pack on your desk. You may keep it only if you are not taking any other AP Exams this year. If you have no other AP Exams to take, place your Student Pack under your chair now. . . .

While Student Packs are being collected, read the "At a Glance" column and the instructions on the back cover of the pink booklet. Do not open the booklet until you are told to do so. Look up when you have finished. . . .

Collect the Student Packs. Then say:

Are there any questions? . . .

SECTION II, PART A: Long Essays

Answer all questions regarding procedure. Then say:

Section II has two parts. You have 1 hour to answer the two questions in Part A. You are advised to spend 30 minutes on each question. I will tell you when 30 minutes have elapsed but you may proceed freely from Question 1 to Question 2. Read the questions carefully and take a moment to think about what the questions ask. You can receive full credit only by answering the questions asked. Organize or outline your essays in the blank space provided above the questions. Notes in that space will not be scored.

Be sure to analyze each question and choose appropriate examples. Identify your examples as fully as possible. You must write your answers in the pink booklet using a pen. If you need more paper during the exam, raise your hand. At the top of each extra piece of paper you use, be sure to write your AP number and the number of the question you are working on. You may not open the shrinkwrapped insert or go on to Part B until you are told to do so. Are there any questions? . . .

Answer any questions. Then say:

Open the Section II booklet to Question 1 on page 4 and begin.

SECTION II, PART B: Short Answer Questions Based on Color Images and/or Text

When you have the students' attention, say:

You'll begin the short answer questions based on images and/or text. The images are reproduced in the Section II green insert. You may now remove the shrinkwrap on the Section II green insert. . . .

In the upper right-hand corner of the cover, print your name, your teacher's name, and your school's name. . . .

Do not open this insert until I tell you to do so.

Questions 3 through 9 are based on color images and/or text.

For any image-based question that does not call for the artist's name or the name of the work, you may refer to the image shown on the left as "L" and the image shown on the right as "R." Each image-based question is based on either one image or a pair of images. You may write on the insert, but the only responses that will be scored are those that are written on the lined pages in the pink booklet. Each question indicates a suggested time of either 5 or 10 minutes for completion. I will announce when each suggested time has elapsed but you may move freely from one question to another throughout this part. Are there any questions? . . .

Answer all questions regarding procedure. Then say:

You may now open the green insert to page 5. Now open the pink Section II booklet to Question 3 on page 16 and begin.



Note Start Time here _____. Note Stop Time here _____. You and your proctors should make sure students are writing their answers in the pink booklet, not in the green insert. After 5 minutes, say:

Five minutes have passed and you are advised to go on to Question 4.

If any students used extra paper for the free-response section, have those students staple the extra sheet/s to the first page corresponding to that question in their free-response booklets. Then say:

Remain in your seat, without talking, while the exam materials are collected. The green insert will be returned to you in about two days.

Collect a pink Section II booklet and green insert from every student. Check for the following:

- Front cover of Section II booklet: The student placed an AP number label in the shaded box, and printed his or her initials and today's date.
- Back cover of Section II booklet: The student completed the "Important Identification Information" area.
- Front cover of green insert: The student completed the identification information.

When all exam materials have been collected and accounted for, return to students any electronic devices you may have collected before the start of the exam. Then say:

You may not discuss the free-response questions in this exam with anyone until two days after this administration. Remember that the multiple-choice questions may never be discussed or shared in any way at any time. You should receive your score report in the mail about the third week of July.

If any students completed the AP number card at the beginning of this exam, say:

Please remember to take your AP number card with you.

Then say:

You are now dismissed.

Exam materials should be put in secure storage until they are returned to the AP Program after your school's last administration. The green and blue inserts should be securely stored for two days and then returned to the Art History teachers for distribution to the students. Before storing materials, check your list of students who are eligible for fee reductions and fill in the appropriate oval on their registration answer sheets. To receive a separate AP Instructional Planning Report or student score roster for each AP class taught, fill in the appropriate oval in the "School Use Only" section of the answer sheet.
