NOMINATIONS FOR 2010

Please note that all candidates considered for national and regional council and committee positions must be affiliated with College Board member institutions. This year, we are seeking to fill positions on the following boards, councils and committees:

Board of Trustees

- Establish policies and procedures related to membership, programs and services.
- Approve the annual budget and major program fees.
- Advise the president, who is responsible for the organization's management.
- Participate in the Board of Trustees meetings in January, March, June and September.
- Attend the Annual Meeting of the Members, held in conjunction with the College Board Forum in late October/early November.

New England Regional Council

- Provide a forum through which College Board members can deliberate on matters of mutual concern.
- Improve communications across the educational spectrum.
- Evaluate and promote the use of College Board programs, services and activities.
- Advise the regional office on educational issues and needs in the region, and regional positions on national issues.
- Attend three meetings per year (May, September and Regional Forum in February).

Financial Aid Division Advisory Committee

- Provide a forum for the consideration of issues related to the economic aspects of attendance at postsecondary educational institutions.
- Advise the regional office on educational issues and needs in the region, and regional positions on national issues.
- Attend three meetings per year (May, September and Regional Forum in February).

Academic Division Advisory Committee

- Provide a forum for the consideration of policies, practices and programs designed to advance student achievement and articulation among academics across K-16.
- Advise the regional office on educational issues and needs in the region, and regional positions on national issues.
- Attend three meetings: April, October and Regional Forum in February.

National Academic Assembly Council

- Offer advice on College Board programs and services that support universal access to high standards of learning.
- Address issues related to curriculum, articulation, assessment, the governance structure of schools and sustained professional development.
- Plan the Annual Meeting and Forum activities for the assembly.
- Manage the affairs of the National Academic Assembly and advise the Board of Trustees and president of the College Board on matters of concern to the assembly.
- Attend meetings in May and December. All reasonable expenses for these meetings are covered by the College Board.

National College Scholarship Service Assembly Council

- Discuss policies, practices and procedures to help students and families prepare to meet the costs of postsecondary education.
- Consider policies, practices and procedures designed to support institutions, agencies and organizations in the equitable and efficient administration of student financial aid programs.
- Identify concerns about educating students, families and the public on financial aid.
- Manage the affairs of the College Scholarship Service Assembly and advise the Board of Trustees and president of the College Board on matters of concern to the assembly.
- Attend meetings in May and December. All reasonable expenses for these meetings are covered by the College Board.
